Your Role as a Mentor

As a mentor, your task is to be a leader and a role model while building a friendship with a child in need of support. Volunteering with Big Brothers Big Sisters is a fun and easy way to positively impact the life of a child.

Your Responsibilities as a Mentor

Your biggest and most important responsibility as a Big Brother or a Big Sister is to be a trusted and caring friend for your Little Brother or Little Sister. That's it! You'll do this by spending time with them on a regular basis doing fun activities and getting to know them. You will be responsible for maintaining contact with Big Brothers Big Sisters for match support purposes. We will also ask you to attend a one-time, three hour new mentor training.

Time Commitment

Just 4-8 hours a month can a change a child's life for the better, forever. You can choose to be a "community-based" mentor where you spend time doing activities in the community or you can be a "site-based" mentor in our Bigs in Schools program where you meet during the academic year at an elementary or middle school on a specific day and time. Most matches prefer to meet about once a week for an hour or two at a time sharing interests, hobbies and experiences. A one year commitment is required. Also, you will check in with us for a periodic 10-15 minute phone conversation for us to hear about how the match is going.

Financial Commitment

There is no cost for becoming a mentor with Big Brothers Big Sisters. It is your choice whether to spend money on your match outings, and how much. Your time and attention are your most valuable assets as a mentor. Our website includes information about free and low-cost opportunities for matches. Our organization also sponsors several activities throughout the year that are free to Bigs & Littles.

Mentor Qualifications

To qualify as a mentor you should be a responsible, caring adult who is interested in spending time having fun with a kid. We will, of course ask you to complete our application process which includes an interview, reference checks and a criminal background check. You should live within the City of Fredericksburg or Stafford, Spotsylvania, King George or Caroline Counties.
